We never imagined we could work directly with Dr. Lois Zachary and Ms. Lory Fischler, the authors of the books we had been using to inform the development of our mentor program. But we were fortunate to be able to do so. From the moment we began working with Dr. Zachary and Ms. Fischler, they worked closely with our team to design a training experience that was tailored to the exact needs of our group of new mentors; their efforts to understand the dynamics of our program and the culture and characteristics of the mentors and future protégés was impressive!

During the actual training, the doubt that many of the new mentors felt gave way to possibility. The tools, resources, structure, and approaches were all placed directly in our hands, and explained with the expertise you can only expect from two talented and capable trainers.

She went on to explain that the passion, energy, and emotion of the mentors would have to be harnessed or it would harness us. These prophetic words have had a profound impact on our awareness and work ever since.
